Giulio Citroni (Calabria University, Italy)

*Administrative change between neo-liberalism and neo-etatism:
the international debate on trends of reform*

The presentation will describe and discuss the main hypotheses on recent trends in administrative reforms across the Western and “developed” states. New public management, new public governance, and the neo-weberian state are all (“new”?) waves of reform which are in different ways and extents related to economic and ideological transformations across a large part of the planet. And the effects these trends have on government action impact on all fields of public policy, including welfare and social work.

Gary Spolander (Coventry University, UK)

Structure Matters: Neoliberalism and its impact on social welfare

Macro-economic policy shapes structures and policy, the provision of social welfare services and their implementation. The commodification of social welfare, as well as private sector philosophy and business processes have impacted on their nature, design and delivery. The resulting impact influences democratic government and shapes social work responses in a variety of intended and unintended directions. The paper proposes that macro-economic understanding is critical to shape social work responses.

Abigail Ornelas (Stellenbosch University, South Africa)

The recent IFSW (2014) change in social work definition emphasises a practice-based profession as well as an academic discipline promoting social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people. Underlying this are the principles of social justice, human rights, collective responsibility and respect for diversities are central to social work. The presentation will use Garrett’s (2013) four conflicting theoretical underpinnings for the social work profession, to explore how this shapes and determines professional understanding of how society is/should be organised and the nature of personal and social change. Reflecting on the change of definition within the context of Garrett’s typology, one can begin to question whether social work is in a process of transition from a therapeutic stand to one that is increasingly socialist and collective. Is this as a result of resistance to implications of neoliberalism on both the profession and service users? Can such a radical call be achieved while still attempting to retain some aspects of therapeutic social work?
